



Bible Study for Busy Lives



Pastor Russ will begin a new Wednesday night Adult Bible study, starting on October 2nd. Participants will seek to have a better understanding of God's Word and live that out in their daily lives as they immerse themselves in a study of the entire Bible - the Old Testament and New Testamenteach in 12 weeks. This study will require two books, starting the first twelve weeks with "Disciple Fast Track— Old Testament", and the second twelve weeks with "Disciple Fast Track— New Testament". If interested in joining this Wednesday night study with Pastor Russ, please let Pastor Russ or the church office know and they can put you on the list.



We are currently looking into the means of live-streaming our worship service. Live-streaming would allow church members who can no longer attend our worship services due to health concerns the ability to do so via their computers or smart phones. This way they could still feel a part of the worshiping community even though they can't be here in person. It would also allow members who are away on vacation, or attending other events such as children's ball games to watch from where they are. Additionally, it would give us the capability to record and store the service on a dedicated computer so they can be accessed from the church website at any time. If for any reason anyone missed church, but still wanted to worship when they got home, they could access the recorded service from our website and watch. This would be a huge outreach tool for those wanting to know more about our church before they ever come. Moreover, as an outreach and/or evangelism tool, it would also give us the capability to record weddings and funerals and load them onto a DVD for family members to have, or simply record the services and give them to homebound community members and/or the nursing homes.

The dedicated system we are looking at is expensive, and so I ask, if you feel this is important for the future of the church, I invite you to prayerfully consider helping offset some of the cost. It includes two cameras to record from two different conspicuous locations in the sanctuary, one at the back and one at the front. The cameras will be out of the way and, for the most part, you will not even notice they are there. To run this program, we would need a dedicated computer and monitor and all of the related software and hardware separate from what we already have. And to house all of the new equipment, we would need a new A / V cabinet that can hold it along with our current A / V equipment. Altogether we are looking at around \$19,000.00 for the installation and proper equipment that will last us well into the future and allow us to do this ministry well. Yes, many churches are using cell phones to do this, but the video quality is much less than what we are hoping to achieve. Plus, with a cell phone unless someone moves it around, it is one fixed location, usually far away at the back of the sanctuary where it is difficult to see what is on the screens or what's going on up on the chancel. The system we are looking at would allow for multiple camera angles and the ability to zoom in and out and show what is being projected on the screens in the sanctuary. The system we want will be installed by professionals and look professionally done when viewing online.

Administrative Council Meeting July 16th, 2019

The regular meeting of the Administrative Council was called to order by and led by Pastor Russ Anderson, starting at 7:05 pm. Pastor first went over the previous Fresh Expressions handout and discussion followed. Business meeting began at 7:35 pm. In attendance were Tom Powell, Marlene Kremlacek, Ashley Meyer, Buzz Todd, Bob Rasmussen, Becky Schwenk, Dave and Nancy Harrington, Pastor Russ Anderson and Carrie Hancock. Pastor Russ entertained a motion to accept the minutes from the June meeting. Buzz Todd made a motion to accept the minutes, Bob Rasmussen

seconded to approve June meeting minutes.

<u>Office:</u> Carrie had received a letter in the office regarding the Christmas Cheer program, a program that was run by the St. Paul Community Senior Center. They are looking for someone to take over this program. As no one at the meeting knew much information on this program, Carrie will see if she can contact the Senior Center and either get more information or have someone come to our next meeting to help explain it.

Carrie also wanted to let everyone know she is working on a new Usher/Greeter list and will most likely email it to those on the list. She also brought up that a set Fellowship list was also discussed at one time, but at this time nothing was decided. Discussion followed. Most were against a set Fellowship list.

<u>Worship:</u> Becky just brought up how well Worship in the Park went. She just mentioned that we may need to move the meat dish on a separate table so that people could walk on either side of the tables to move thing along more smoothly. Pastor said we will probably need to have hot dogs next year so that the kids will be more likely to eat! <u>Memorial:</u> Marlene reported that they have \$3,253 in Memorial. \$2,000 of this is to go to the new video/livestream system if it is decided to go forward with it. No new word on this video system as of right now. Pastor is looking into a Grant to see if it would work towards it. Discussion on this followed.

<u>SPPRC</u>: Bob reported that Pastor had met with a representative from where we have our custodian services, Integrated Life Choices. Apparently at one time they used to come up and clean after weddings and funerals and that has not been happening. They will begin doing this again. They discussed what is needing to be done here at the church, and stressed the church will probably need a more in-depth cleaning either quarterly or every 6 months, which will require more hours. Everyone in attendance agreed to every 6 months. Bob entertained a motion for them to come every 6 months, Dave approved and Marlene seconded. Everyone approved. UMW, Trustees and Worship will work on a list for the custodians as to what they will want in a deep cleaning every 6 months.

<u>Trustees</u>: Buzz reported that we are still waiting on a bill from Carpet Plus for materials but that the office received a bill for installation already. (Carrie just handed over a copy to Buzz) It appears to be as expected. He also reported that they are working on getting a new screen door put on the Parsonage as the handle was broken on the old one. He also has Vincent Christensen coming to the meeting next month to go over the quote that Christensen Insurance has made out for the church.

<u>Treasurer:</u> Tom Powell reported (as of June 30th) our Operating Checking account is (\$6,317), Resources Available \$49,646, Income Giving \$9,345, Total Income \$10,533, Total Expenditures \$15,108, Current Month Gain/(Loss) (\$4,575), and Year to date Gain/(Loss) \$3,042.

<u>Finance:</u> Dave reported the Golf Tournament is coming up on August 17th. He went over the general information on it. Dave made a motion to give 10% of the money made for Youth Ministries, Marlene seconded. After further discussion, an amended motion was made of 20% to Youth Ministries. All were in agreement to go with the 20%.

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<u>Education</u>: Ashley reported that the kids had a great time at camp in June. She was thinking that a date to start Sunday School will be September 15th, and they will try for after church service instead of before.

<u>Outreach:</u> Nancy reported that the kids had fun helping with the parade for GCA Days, handing out 180 fruit snacks. If we would like to do the St. Paul's Public School PTO'S back to school open house, it is on August 15th. We may need volunteers in helping with this.

Healthy Congregation: No report

<u>Pastor:</u> He reported that Lay Leadership met and Carol Phillips agreed to be a member of the Memorial committee and Nancy Harrington agreed to be the co-chair of the Education Committee. As this is in the middle of the year, the Ad Council needs to vote to approve this. Bob made a motion to approve Carol and Nancy into these committees and Buzz Todd seconded. All are in favor and it is approved.

Pastor also commented that a membership audit will be worked on in the office in an effort to try and clean it up. <u>UMW:</u> Carol Tjernagel sent an email as she would not be able to make it. It is as follows:

On Tuesday, July 9th, 7 members went on a field trip to visit Epworth Village. Marlene Kremlacek,

Ursula Sorlie, Cleo Edwards, Carol Phillips, Theda Van Horn, Charlene Craig and Carol Tjernagel visited Little Jewels Child Care and Enrichment Center and had an interesting overview of the Epworth facility, the Foster parenting program and the history of the buildings and their use by Mary Plock. Epworth Village is one of our mission partners and it was reassuring to see how we are helping them. We also presented them with several in-kind donations provided by our members.
