February 2023 Newsletter- The month of Cleansing

February comes from the Latin word februa, which means "to cleanse." The month was named after the Roman feast Februalia, which was a month-long festival of purification and atonement that took place around the month of February. It is therefore fitting that Ash Wednesday falls into the month of February this year. So, on February the 22nd, we will gather in the evening at 6:30 pm to worship and to come honestly to God in repentance. All those towering walls that would obscure our real self will be let down. We will invite the Holy Spirit to purge our souls and make us whole.

The notion of Ash Wednesday can be found in the words of Prophet Joel where he says, "Even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning." ¹³ Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. ¹⁴ Who knows? He may turn and relent and leave behind a blessing...". God invites his people to examine their hearts and return to him with sincerity.

On Ash Wednesday we are marked on our foreheads with ashes and the pastor utters the words, "you are dust and to dust you will return". This phrase comes from God's response to Adam (Genesis 3:19) when he sinned. God reminded Adam of the effects of what he had done. He had to die and return to dust. It was devastating, especially because Adam specifically, and humans in general had no ability to rescue themselves from this imminent death, only God could do that for them. Lent then is a time when human beings acknowledge this fact. It is when believers say; we realize our error, we are turning back to God in repentance. We turn around from the direction we were going to a godward direction from now henceforth.

Ash Wednesday will also usher the beginning of the lent season where we will be walking through the spiritual disciplines and challenge ourselves to practice them as we draw closer to God. Disciplines such as fasting, solitude, repentance, helping the poor, forgiveness, and Bible reading. We will remind ourselves that without God at work in our lives we are not good people, and we are prone to anger, wrath, malice, slander, selfishness, pride, and other God-dishonoring behaviors. N. T Wright reminds us that "Lent is a time for discipline, for confession, for honesty, not because God is mean or fault-finding or finger-pointing but because he wants us to know the joy of being cleaned out, ready for all the good things he now has in store." It is like getting ready for a big event. We clean up, we exfoliate, we get a haircut, or a nice hair do. We get ready. Lent is a getting ready for the big celebration at Easter.

Our Lent study this year will be done in-person on Wednesday evenings from 6.30-7.30 PM. It is titled Jesus in the Wild: Lessons on calling for Life in the World. Make sure to register yourself so we can get the needed books to facilitate the study. I can't wait to get into the challenge of drawing closer to God, getting all cleaned up, and being made ready to celebrate the greatest victory in life at Easter. Happy cleansing month!

LENT STUDY



This year's Lenten Study will begin on Wednesday, March 1st. It will be held here at the church from 6:30-7:30pm and will be led by Pastor Susan. This study will be based on a book, *Jesus in the Wild* by Dan Wilt. In *Jesus in the Wild* you'll take a forty-day journey into the heart of one of the most unusual, and often most misunderstood, stories in the Gospel accounts. In this encounter, following his baptism in the Jordan and before the inauguration of his ministry, Jesus is alone with the adversary—the one whose works he had come to destroy (1 John 3:8). He faces three tests, or "temptations"—all aimed at unseating him from his identity, his belovedness, and his purpose as the Son of God.
