In the tech world, the month of May has also earned an unofficial holiday referred to as "Star Wars Day" on the 4th. The fourth day in May became Star Wars Day when the words "May the force be with you," used by Jedi masters in the Star wars movies, were converted to the phrase "May the Fourth be with you."

While someone was reading from

Martin Luther's Preface to the Epistle to the Romans, he felt that his heart was "strangely warmed." He describes it this way: I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone, for salvation, and an assurance was given me that he had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death.

That marked a day of new beginnings for Wesley.

Some of us are cultivating land, others are planting, and yet others are winding up school either as teachers or students. Some families are getting prepared for an early summer vacation or camping trip. Others will be celebrating Cinco de Mayo, Mexico's grand celebration of their victory over the second French empire. Whatever it is that is coming up for you, may you be aware of God's presence in the new things and new schedules. God's power is there to help us in our beginnings and aid us in having great conclusions. The calendar and the lifestyle in May might differ from what we have had in the past months, but we face the change with bravery.

Remembering that God is with us in the endings and also in the beginnings.

He was with Paul, and Wesley, and us in seasons past, and he is faithful to do it again. Enjoy your season and trust that God goes with you! Amen
