A Holy Spirit Story: From The Mother Of A Marine

Excerpt from the Wake-Up Call (May 6th 2023)

Today's Holy Spirit story comes to us from Anna Hogan. It is a gripping story that involves a recent international tragedy that we will all likely remember.

I am the mother of four United States Marines. On August 30, 2021, one of my sons called to tell me he would be going to Afghanistan on a mission. From the field somewhere deep in the Middle East, he said goodbye via Facetime.

We both cried.

"Mom, I have to go. There are women and children that need to be rescued."

This began the hardest nine days of my life as a mother.

My body held tension between anxiety and fear. I attempted to live a normal life for the first twenty-four hours, but that proved to be impossible. Within a few hours, I received eleven text messages from different women and families in my church.

"We are praying."

"We just saw the news, praying for you."

"I'm bringing you dinner, even if you don't want it."

I could hardly read them or respond. I decided to take a walk to the pond at the end of the road in my neighborhood. As I walked, I prayed, "God, please protect my boy. Put a shield around him and let him live."

I prayed for the soldiers, and my mind was reeling with all the "what ifs." Within a few days, the mission began to unfold on CNN and every other news source. It seemed to be everywhere. It was Sunday morning, and the pastor prayed for my boy and two others. He announced there would be a prayer service the next day.

I decided to attend. Unable to pray aloud, I rested my head on my folded arms and listened.

So I listened. I listened to the prayers of the people. I heard the groans of the Spirit in the prayers of my friends—pleas for protection, for God to keep these soldiers alive. In this place of desperation, I felt the Spirit's comfort.

I knew there was nothing left in me but to wait. The next day the news broke to the world that thirteen men had been killed at the Abby Gate.

My heart shattered.

I wept for the mothers and families of those twelve Marines and one Corpsman.

Days passed, and I had no idea if my son was injured, alive, or dead.

Sunday morning, I headed to worship. I needed it. I needed to sing to the only one who would one day bring true peace; who would make all things new.

During the sermon, my phone rang. It was my son. He had been unable to call until he could borrow a phone because the blast destroyed his cell phone. Many were injured that day, my son included, but I will never ever forget the comfort of the Spirit moving through prayer those nine days.

He is always with us. And he will pray for us. See Romans 8:26
