Lots of talk from world leaders but little impact in terms of peace and justice. Many countries are experiencing terrorism, strife, or a full-blown war. How can we hope for better times while we see so much death and suffering in people's lives? As people of faith, Proverbs 3: 5-7 reminds us of these words "Trust in the Lord with all your heart; and lean not in your own understanding.

In all your ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct your paths. Be not wise in your own eyes: fear the Lord and depart from evil." Our trust is in the Lord's guidance. In a world marked by division and strife, the idea of being guided by God invites us to join him in his redemptive work by cultivating kindness, forgiveness, and empathy. It prompts us to extend a helping hand to those in need, to foster understanding in the face of differences, and to be a source of light in the lives of others. It is essential to anchor our hopes in a deeper, more enduring source. God's power will uplift and sustain us through life's challenges. As we navigate the terrain of the coming year, we can find solace in the belief that we are not alone – that a higher power walks with us, offering guidance, wisdom, and grace. Trust in the Lord with all your heart; and lean not in your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight in 2024. Happy New Year!
