April Newsletter: Living As Easter People

Happy Easter! Did we not already do that last Sunday? One may wonder. Is it not over yet? Not really! It is still Easter because it isn't just a one-day affair. Rather, it's a season. The early church celebrated Easter for fifty days. Christians marked this season with joyous music and intentional spiritual renewal. It was a period to celebrate Christ's victory over death and the forces of evil, giving God's people renewed hope of God's promise of new life in Christ. Following the resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples over a period of forty days, teaching them about the kingdom of God and commissioning them to spread the Good News to all nations. On Pentecost, which was the fiftieth day, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, empowering them to proclaim the Gospel with boldness and authority.

A resurrected life however, goes on even beyond the fifty days. The Easter life that Christ calls us to live is an everyday life from the moment we get to know him to the day he calls us home. We pursue a new life and new creation and seek to grow in our relationship with God through prayer, worship, and acts of service. We also extend God's grace to others as taught by Jesus. We become agents of transformation, as we seek to bring healing to the broken world.

Living as the people of Easter means being a light in a world that sometimes feels as if it is covered in total darkness. As people of Easter, we move into the mission field carrying the light of Jesus. Praying for the sick, feeding the hungry, embracing the poor, and loving the outcasts. Just as nature is showing signs of new life in the springtime, we too are called to undergo a spiritual rebirth, shedding our old ways, and embracing the abundant life that Christ offers. We strive to become more fully the people that God created us to be.

Ultimately, living as the people of Easter means bearing witness to the reality of Christ's resurrection in the world. It means proclaiming the Good News of salvation. We are ambassadors of Christ, we are called to share the hope and joy of Easter with others, inviting them to experience the transformative love of God for themselves. In doing so, we participate in God's ongoing work of redemption and renewal and contribute to the building of a kingdom where God is king, and life is just and wholesome. So, allow me to continue the celebration we started on Sunday, and invite you to deliberately live as an active agent of God's kingdom. Happy Easter!
