It's hard to believe that August is here and school is right around the corner. For many of us, it marks the beginning of new routines and the end of summer (maybe with one last hurrah for Labor Day).

As we begin our new routines, whether as parents, youth, grandparents, I encourage you to make your faith and church part of the plan. When we become part of a church, and especially when we join a church, we make vows. A vow is, by definition, a solemn promise. One of those vows is to faithfully participate in the life and ministries of our local congregation through our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. We make these vows for two reasons. First, they help us grow in our faith and discipleship, they are directly related to what John Wesley called the means of grace. Second, through the church, they multiply our ability as disciples of Jesus Christ to make disciples of Jesus Christ.

The vow of prayer includes spending time in prayer. This includes confessing our brokenness and failings, listening for God's voice and the movement of the Holy Spirit, thanking God for the blessings large and small in our lives, and lifting your needs and those of the community and church. The vow of presence means showing up. Being present at church and being part of the community of faith. When we are present, we learn not only from pastors and other leaders, but from each other. We support one another. We build relationships. When we are not there, it becomes increasingly harder to do those things.

The vow relating to our gifts often gets relegated to our financial gifts. Our financial gifts are important to our church because they facilitate our presence in the community and multiply our ministries (building and resources). However, they are not the only gifts that we commit to the church. Our gifts also include spiritual gifts as well as God-given talents. There are lots of ways to discern your spiritual gifts. You can take an assessment like the one found on the UMC website ( <a href="https://www.umc.org/en/content/exploring-your-spiritual-gifts">https://www.umc.org/en/content/exploring-your-spiritual-gifts</a>), talk with folks who know you well, or reflect on things you enjoy doing. Your talents may simply be things such as decorating, playing or singing music, or something completely different. And, there are often ways that those can be used in the church.

The vow to being in faithful service has avenues within the church and outside of it. It can include leadership roles such as church boards and committees, teaching Sunday school, and also being the hands of feet of Jesus in our church. It can also include community in areas such as the food pantry and volunteer organizations.

The vow of witnessing is often one that I hear that folks are nervous about. We are called to witness to our faith through words. To talk about Jesus, to give glory to God. But it can be done in simple ways. Sharing a way that God has worked in your life, inviting someone to church and sharing how your church shapes your faith or why you call your church home are easy ways this can be done. We also witness to our faith with our actions. How we show up for folks, how we respond to life's challenges, our attitude and countenance toward and around others, and how we treat others (and ourselves- that love our neighbors as ourselves things) are all ways we witness to our faith.

So, please make living into these vows- within the church and in your every day lives- part of your routines this fall and beyond.

Now, on a personal note, I just want to say "Thank You." Thank you for the welcome that I and my family have received. Thank you to those who helped make preparations for our move here, who provided meals and lodging, who prayed for us, and who have encouraged us. We are excited to be here and to be part of the church and community. I look forward to continuing to get to know you and hear your stories. I look forward to sharing meals and coffee with you because you learn different things about people sitting around dinner tables than you do around meeting tables. I look forward to walking with you on this journey of faith. Thank you!

Pastor Nicole or the church office know so we can add them to our teacher prayers. Thank You!



We're also planning a fall kick-off with a BBQ or picnic type meal plus explanations or discussion about the home group communities.
