Disaster Response News

Over the past Two years in the Great Plains Untied Methodist Conference we were blessed to not experience wide-spread and destructive natural disasters. That pattern has ended. Since January 1, 2024, we have experienced a larger number of disasters that have left so many in our communities in need of assistance. Our volunteers have been on the ground responding. We continue to respond in the Long-Term Recovery process with the Nebraska and Kansas tornadoes and a Kansas flooding event.

An important piece of our ministry of compassion and care is our Disaster Response Assistance Fund. This fund is generated by the faithful donations from individuals and local churches in our conference. One hundred percent of donations goes toward the need of the survivor. In a typical year we normally receive around 50 applications for assistance. Since the first of this year we have received 153 request. Our conference disaster response team has been faithful to be good stewards of our funds. With the larger than normal request, our assistance fund is depleted.
