Hello church family! As I write this newsletter article, I can't help but think about all the awesome things going on in our church and our community. I have been to two clergy gatherings in the last 2 weeks. The first was continuing education at Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, KS. There were about 1500 pastors and leaders from 517 churches in 44 states plus Korea and Uganda. While we were there, we learned from one another and our speakers and were encouraged and inspired by worship and one another's stories. I am looking forward to sharing different parts of what I learned while I was there.

This week, I attended a Central Nebraska District (formerly Prairie Rivers District) clergy

gathering. One of the questions we were asked to answer during our introductions was,

"What is one thing that is unique, special, or exciting that is going on in the congregation that you serve?" I had a hard time with the question because I had a lot to choose from. It's a joy to have too many things to share! Small groups, worship, service, prayer, youth, children's church, living our faith in the community- I could have gone on and on! As I think about all of the awesome things going on, I also have to recognize that there are some really hard and heart breaking things going on in our world, too. The continued issue of school shootings and threats of violence breaks my heart. The continued impact of natural disasters and concerns for those who are living the aftermath of Hurricane Helene weighs heavily on my heart. The realities of those who are living in war torn areas and the recent attacks in the Middle East makes me thankful for the relative safety that surrounds me while giving me pause to be concerned for our world. I also look around and see the widening divide in our country, communities, and even families due to political and ideological differences. I see increasing inability to treat people with dignity and respect even when we disagree. In all of these things, though, I remember that there is power in prayer and that God is in the midst of all of those situations. I am also reminded that God has called us to use our lives, voices, and resources to be instruments of hope, comfort, and change. One way that we can do this is by joining with United Methodists worldwide in supporting the United Methodist Committee on Relief as they respond to disasters. In this newsletter, you will find information about contributing to their Hurricane Helene efforts. Another way that our church will be living into this calling is by joining with other churches around the United States in the Campaign for Kindness with our Do Unto Others sermon series which begins October 6th and will continue through November 3rd. Based on Matthew 7:12, the scripture often called "The Golden Rule" this sermon series will "challenge us to engage in conversation and seek to create whatever common good we can with our relatives, friends, and neighbors who we might consider to be on the "other side" politically and ideologically. As we attempt to come together, the idea is not that we are obliterating either one or trying to change each other, but rather we discover the beauty that can be created when we work together to make the world a better place." As those who follow Christ, we are called to cultivate kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love for one another and for the

good of all the world, no matter what, and we will be looking at many of those scriptures


Save the Date!!









Fall Ministry Celebration
