As I sit here writing this, I am thinking about the connectional system. It's not something we think about as often in the daily life of the church when we are focused on the ministries of our local congregation. It comes up occasionally during appointive season when we hear about our new pastor and where they've been or where our current one is going to. Sometimes we hear about the organizational structures of the church when the District Superintendent shows up, we hear a message from the Bishop or Council of Bishops, the pastor and lay representative return from annual conference, when a pastor is a delegate (or in Pastor Susan's case, interpreter) for General Conference, or an activity or article from elsewhere in the connection is shared.

But, what is the connectional system really. According to the article "Organization: The Church as Connection on UMC.org, "The United Methodist structure and organization began as a means of accomplishing the mission of spreading scriptural holiness. Methodism's founder, John Wesley, recognized the need for an organized system of communication and accountability and developed what he called the "connexion," a network of classes, societies, and annual conferences. Today, our denomination continues to be organized in a "connectional" system, which "enables us to carry out our mission in unity and strength" (Book of Discipline, ¶ 701). Every local church is linked to an interconnected network of organizations that join together in mission and ministry, allowing us to accomplish far more than any one local church or person could alone." So, structure, accountability system, and mission network. All of these are important pieces of it. As a cradle roll United Methodist I find all of these pieces important.

The structure and accountability system, while very important, are not the parts of the connectional system that make me love the UMC. As I sit here today, it's the mission network that makes me proud to be United Methodist. This morning as I was drinking my coffee and checking Facebook while watching the morning news, I was watching the devastation in California due to the wildfires, I saw a post from United Methodist Committee on Relief asking for prayers and offering ways to support disaster relief there, as well as in other places. Because we are part of a connection, we already have "boots on the ground" who can aid with relief quickly.

I also have a more personal reason that I am thinking about the connectional system today. With my mother in the hospital and the impending snowstorm last weekend, my husband decided to contact a couple of United Methodist Churches in St. Joseph, where the hospital is, to see if a pastor would be available to visit her. Pastor Doug of Ashland UMC answered the call to action. As my aunt said, "I know if I look for the cross and flame, I will find a church in ministry." It makes me think of all the pastors and prayer lists that are lifting up my mom, many of whom she has never met. It also makes me think about our church and the care and support that we show to one another.

One last thing, as I reflect on 2024 with the coming of the new year, I also want to take a minute once more to say thank you. Thank you for the joy of celebrating Christmas together this year. Thank you for your generosity and ministry. Thank you for your prayers, patience and support as we navigate this health crisis with my momma. Thank you for being the church in St. Paul, NE. Thank you for BEING church.
