As we head into March, there are several things that are on my mind.

Lent- Just a reminder that Lent starts with Ash Wednesday on March 5. Ash Wednesday morning, from 6:30-7:50 a.m., we will offer Ashes-to-Go remembering that our ashes are an outward symbol of our faith that is visible as we go about our day. At 7pm we will have an Ash Wednesday worship service. Our youth groups will help lead that service. Please join us for that service.

Our Lenten Worship Series will be "We Believe: Exploring the Apostles Creed." We are faithful disciples when we are true to our word. We will spend Lent looking at the phrases in the Apostles Creed, thinking not only about what they mean but how they shape our faith. We will begin the series on March 9th.

Prayer Group- There has been interest in resuming a prayer group. During Lent, we will resume meeting weekly to pray over the prayer requests from Sunday, the teacher prayer list, and other prayer requests we receive. We may explore different prayer practices as we do this. We will meet on Wednesdays at 11am beginning March 12.

Time Change- Don't forget to "Spring Forward" on March 9th.

Opportunities- There are two trainings that I would like the congregation to attend.

* The Caring Congregation- The Caring Congregation (TCC) believes that care is at the heart of every church and is an action word for kindness, compassion, connection, love and justice. This training would be a step in exploring the creation of a Care Team and include the why and how team members would give care. In some ways, it is similar to a Stephen ministry team. The Training is happening March 21-22 at Omaha Faith Westwood and is subsidized by our district apportionments so a team cost \$100 total for all materials. If you would be interested in attending the two day training with Pastor Nicole, please let me know.

* Healthy Congregations Retreat- If you want to learn more about approachable, effective ways to connect, partner and engage to improve health in your congregation and community, you'll want to attend this fun, inspirational retreat. This two-day, uplifting event will focus on connecting, learning, sharing and developing relationships with others who share a passion for congregational and community health. This training is free and includes free hotel accommodation. It is April 10-11 in Salina, KS. Please let me (Pastor Nicole) know if you are interested in attending by March 14th in order to register for included overnight accommodation.

Confirmation- Do you have youth that are ready for confirmation? I would like to see if there are enough youth ready to hold a confirmation class (at least 4 students enhances the experience, though it can be done with fewer). Confirmation is an opportunity for youth to gather with their peers, adult leaders, and their pastor and learn about their faith. On Confirmation Sunday, they will be "Confirmed," making a public acceptance of their faith by answering the same questions for themselves that their parents answered at their baptism. They will also take the same vows of membership in the United Methodist Church and the local congregation that all who join are asked. Confirmation typically takes place at or around 6th grade, but according to denominational guidelines, readiness for confirmation is "not so much about a chronological age, but rather about one's readiness to assume the vows of professing membership." So, if you have a youth that, as a parent, you believe is ready for confirmation, let Pastor Nicole know.

Summer- The Great Plains Annual Conference Volunteers in Ministry is planning a Summer Family VIM Experience. We can join others in mission, ministry, and fun from June 16-20. If you would be interested, let me (Pastor Nicole) know!

Also, there are some great opportunities for our children and youth to attend church camp this summer!
