Yesterday, my dear husband let me know that there are "only" 200 days until Christmas. Maybe it's because his birthday is Christmas Eve, or because he loves the Christmas season, or simply because he likes to pick on me that he does this. We often do that, though. We keep our eyes toward the next thing— especially if it is something that we enjoy. It's not entirely a bad thing. Sometimes it simply gives us joy, and other times it can help us through difficult times.

Sometimes we think this way about "mountain top experiences" that we have in our faith life. We recently heard the story of Jesus' mountain top experience found in Matthew, Mark, and Luke, where some of his disciples see him transfigured, see him speaking with Moses and Elijah, then hear God speaking that Jesus is his son and should be listened to. It is shortly following this that Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem. I often wonder if this "mountain top experience" sustained them through the hard things that were to come. As I write this, it is not lost on me that we will enter into Holy Week in a couple of weeks. We will walk with Jesus through those hard things— through righteous anger and flipping of tables, scheming and condemnation by religious leaders, a final meal, betraval by his disciple, arrest and wrongful conviction, political persecution, abandonment, and crucifixion on a cross. It is tempting to skip all of this and head straight to Easter, not to spend time on the messy part in-between. To count the days until the holiday without a second thought about the events between now and then. We're busy, it's unsettling, ugly, scary, hard. It's tempting, even for me, to sanitize this story for my son. For myself. I want to challenge us not to do that. See, to understand the depth of God's grace and the price that was paid, we must experience this week. We must hear the story, feel the sadness, sit in the pain. There is a darkness that we must experience during Holy Week to know the fullness of joy that Easter brings. We cannot rush past it, no matter how much we want to. Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor reminds us that "new life starts in the dark. Whether it is a seed in the ground, a baby in the womb, or Jesus in the tomb, it starts in the dark." This year, I invite you to worship not only on Palm Sunday when Hosannas ring out as Jesus enters Jerusalem and on Easter when we sing in praise and wonder at the empty tomb, but also on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday as we remember Jesus' life and his crucifixion. On Maundy Thursday (April 17th), we will have Stations of Jesus' Life from 4:30-6 p.m.

On Maundy Thursday (April 17th), we will have Stations of Jesus' Life from 4:30-6 p.m. You will receive a guide and be able to go through the stations at your own pace, taking as long as you want. At each station, there is a small action, a prayer, and an item to take with you. Parents and grandparents who have done it with children have said it is a very meaningful experience, as well.

On Good Friday (April 18th), we will have a Tenebrae Service at 7 p.m. A Tenebrae service is a "service of light and darkness" or "service of shadows." We will spend time in prayer, singing, and hearing the passion narrative once more, until at last the Christ Candle— the one we light on Christmas Eve to remember Jesus' birth— is extinguished.

On Easter (April 20th), there will be two opportunities for worship. We will hold a sunrise service at 6:45 a.m. at the home of the Voigts with a coffee fellowship following. There will also be our regularly scheduled Easter worship service at 10:00 a.m. that morning. I look forward to experiencing the joy of the resurrection anew with you this year! Its exuberance will be amplified as we journey into the depths of Holy Week together! We will sing Alleluia together with joy!





The meeting on March 18th was called to order by Deb Wells.

Devotions: Deb Wells—theme was Jesus is our refuge in a storm.

Minutes: The minutes from the last meeting of January 14 were read by Cheryl Yoder in the absence of the secretary. One name correction was made to change the attendance to reflect that Darla Voigt was present instead of "Darlene." No other corrections were made.

Treasurer Report: Jackie Cook gave the Treasurer's report. The previous balance was \$556.68. The present balance is \$858.68. Income came from a donation of \$250.00, lunch of \$75.00, and \$1.00 from the Corsage for Mission. \$24.00 was paid out for the subscription for Response magazine.

Correspondence: Deb Wells presented a form to sign up for the District Spring event which will be held in Albion, NE on April 26th. A letter from Epworth was received as a request for donations for general support.

Old Business: Deb Wells and Charlene Craig presented information on the World Day of Prayer and how it went. It was also stated that Carol Phillips had suggested since there are few quilters active in the church at this time that the tubs of the fabric scraps stored at the church could be donated to a group in GI that quilts for Grain Train. There are also two bolts of upholstery type fabric that could be disposed of from our storage. It was moved by Dorthea Fairbanks and seconded by Rose Ross to donate the fabric as suggested.

Cheryl Yoder and Darla Voigt presented on the Children's Bible presentations. Two of the Bibles have been given out but there are still several left to present to families already identified. Scheduling this has been difficult, and a more casual approach is to be taken such as catching the families at church and providing the Bibles to them at that time.

New Business: World Day of Prayer is March 23. Darla moved that we send \$25 to the United Women of Faith Legacy Endowment Fund. Charlene seconded the motion.

Pastor Nicole notified the group that there is a Congregational Care Ministry training on Friday March 21 & Saturday March 22. She stated they have these at different times, but this one was close for us. She was presenting it if anyone was interested.

Pastor Nicole also advised that she would be having her regular Community hours at Bedhead this Thursday, but not on the 27th as she has other commitments.

The Business Meeting was adjourned by Deb Wells.
